**Part A :**

**What is the plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement & what is the outcome by the end of the year ?**

Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the college met on April 15, 2005 in the college campus. Resolutions in the form of following suggestions were passed by the members.

**1. Expansion of the horizon of “earn and learn scheme” :**

It was suggested that contacts be established with some relevant companies, banks, offices etc. where students selected under “Earn & Learn scheme” can find engagement on hourly basis. This should be over and above the students who are assigned work on the campus.

**2. Establishment of a model class room :**

Them members resolved that a model class room should be made functional from the academic session 2004-05. The model classroom should be equipped with audio-visual teaching aids. It should be put to optimum used. All records concerning the use of this classroom should be maintained.

**3. Introduction of self financing Capsule Course:**

The members strongly recommended that some self financing capsule courses should be introduced from the current academic year. The courses identified should have some employment potential. Some such courses identified are

- i) Repair & maintenance of domestic appliances
- ii) P.C. assembly & maintenance
- iii) Electronic hobby kits making
- iv) Child care and development

#### **4. Further strengthening the roll of the alumni Association :**

After due assessment of the activities of the alumni association the committee members advised the following :

- i) Increase in the membership base of the association by aggressive registration.
- ii) Forming of the trust & its registration
- iii) Holding of Annual General Body meeting
- iv) Felicitating members of the association for any of their achievements in the concerned year.
- v) Arranging lecture by some of the distinguished alumni.
- vi) Arranging of session for interaction of students with alumni on some topics beneficial to the students.
- vii) Separate programme by & for the alumni on the eve of the annual social gathering in the college.

#### **5. Parent Teacher Association :**

The members recommended that some useful & productive lectures by some distinguished guardians / parents should be arranged for the benefit of students. At least two meeting should be held with the parents / guardians in an academic year so as to have feedback.

The IQAC members recommended that some staff members in the parent-teacher association should be deputed to attend some such meetings in the other institutions where such associations have proved beneficial.

#### **Action initiated on the suggestions made by IQAC is as follows :**

1. An innovative programme of "Earn & Learn Scheme" has been introduced in the college, whereby students are assigned some job in the college office, library or laboratories on hourly basis. Economically challenged students are selected. This year 38 students got the benefit of the scheme. Engagement for such students outside the campus too was explored this year as recommended by the IQAC. However, unfortunately no student agreed to work outside the college campus citing parental pressure as the reason. This type of mind set still prevalent in this semi-urban part of Maharashtra.

2. Establishment of a model classroom could not materialize this academic session due to some unavoidable reason. However, the college managing committee is on the job & it shall be functional by Nov. 2006
3. The process of introduction of self financing capsule courses as recommended by IQAC has been started. Syllabus for the courses has been framed. Fee structure determined & faculty identified. The courses have been given due publicity & also introduced in the college prospectus. The courses shall be run from the academic year 2006-07.
4. This year activities of the alumni association involved
  - i) Lectures by some prominent alumni for the benefit of the students.
  - ii) A programme was held by the alumni on the eve of annual social gathering in the college.
5. As per the recommendations of the IQAC, communication was established with the parents & information gathered about them by way of questionnaires. A meeting was called & the parents came face to face with the teachers. A fruitful interaction followed. Suggestions were recorded and some are being seriously considered for implementation.

A list of parents who have excelled in various fields was prepared. One amongst these, Mr. Hiralal Chavan, lecturer in Economics was invited to the college to deliver a lecture to the students. He spoke on "Rights of a consumer". Such interaction shall be continued in the coming session.

## **Part B**

### **1. Activities reflecting the goals & objectives of the institution :**

In tune with the objective of the institution to shape model personalities, introduction of appropriate activities from time to time is a continuous process.

The activities are nurtured & continuously improved upon.

Major activities that have become part and parcel of the institution include the following:

- i) Counseling cell, framed every year at the beginning of the academic session, is doing a commendable job. It counsels the students & their guardians about the selection of the faculty & subject combination they ought to offer. The members of the cell are also available to the students the year round to sort out any problems academic or otherwise.
- ii) A very active career guidance committee is functional in the college. It organizes very fruitful programmes like lecture series & workshops during the academic session. These programs have proved of immense benefit to the students. This committee has been expanded from this year. It has been entrusted with the job of discharging placement services for the benefit of outgoing students.
- iii) "Earn & Learn scheme" that provides financial aid to some deserving economically challenged students has taken firm roots. Funds from various sources are raised. More & more deserving students are brought under its ambit every year.
- iv) Students are persuaded & encouraged to participate in different cultural programmes held on & off the campus. This job is shouldered by Art Circle. This year these activities included kavyavachan ( Poetry reading ) competition, Bhavgeet, Street plays, Classical song singing competition, Classical dance, Skits, Fancy dress competitions, Rangoli competition, Mehendi application competition & Essay writing & Numerical skill competition. Students participated in these competitions within the college & also in intercollege events.
- v) Debating club manned by students has matured over the years. It plays a significant role in shaping personalities of students. Debating competitions are regularly organized in the college in three languages viz. English, Hindi, Marathi. Students are also prepared for intercollegiate competitions.

- vi) Annual social gathering manned & managed by students continues to be a star attraction. It is an occasion where students shed all inhibitions and voluntarily exhibit their talent. Students are encouraged to participate & their talent honed after many rehearsals. The programmes include Dance, Acting, Mimicry, One act play etc. besides students who have excelled in curricular, co-curricular or extra certificate & cash or medals. These are sponsored by permanent donors & college sources.
- vii) Welcome party by students for the new entrants is an occasion to be seen to be believed. It is completely managed by students. It has matured into a very serious occasion providing a good platform to identify talent among the freshly admitted students. They are motivated and get a good chance to shed their inhibitions.
- viii) NCC & NSS units continue to play a very significant role in the affairs of the college. Besides regular activities of NCC the cadets do all policing during various functions in the college. This year NCC students of the college were selected for Para- sailing & trekking camps. Traffic control in the city, Rock climbing camp. Republic day camp etc. This year Miss. Gitanjali Thakare from our college NCC unit was selected for Republic Day parade at New Delhi. 07 cadets of our college NCC unit passed 'B' certificate & 06 cadets passed 'C' certificate .
- ix) To keep the system working & vibrant feed back from students is obtained every year covering various aspects like Curriculum; Working of Library, Office, Laboratories, Gymnasium & Canteen; availability & status of other facilities like drinking water points, lavatories etc. This year the feed back so obtained was put before the IQAC. The members took notice of the feedback before suggesting measures for the academic year 2006-07. besides, suggestion boxes are also placed at convenient points for the use of students. It too has become a convenient mode or the students to express their view on various matters. These views are also given a serious thought.
- x) Feed back about the working of the teachers is also obtained from the students every year. Based on the feed back, the Principal briefs the concerned teachers individually. The whole affair is taken in the right spirit

by all since the goal is to improve the system with the ultimate aim to benefit the student.

- xi) The front page of the annual college magazine is conceptualized by the students. Ideas with drawings are invited & the best of the lot is selected. It sets a healthy competition among the students. Front page of the college magazine of the academic year 2004-05 by Miss. Pratibha Arun Thakur has received second prize of Rs. 1000/- in the intercollegiate magazine competition organized by North Maharashtra University.
- xii) An opinion poll is conducted in every academic year on some burning current problem. This year topic floated was "Sex selective abortions : abortions of female fetuses". A questionnaire was prepared for the purpose. About 300 students from all faculties participated. Students were unanimous in holding society at large responsible for this sad state of affairs. They believed that female has lowered to a subordinate level due to the evil of payment of dowry. Some students attributed it to the age old belief that sons are responsible for continuity of family & hence are superior. While others held the patrilineal inheritance pattern responsible. Students feel that legislation has not been successful or effective & a majority of them agreed that education, empowerment & economic upliftment of women is the right remedy.
- xiii) English Department continues to conduct a self financing certificate course in "Spoken English". It is open to students from all faculties. A batch of 30 students attended this course in this academic session.

The topic selected for the seminar was “Decline in sex ratio in India & its impact : Economic, Social & Psychological”. 80 participants from different parts of the state attended the seminar. 27 papers were presented. Prominent scholars who attended included Prof. M.R. Bardapurkar, Dr.B. A. M. University, Aurangabad; Prof. P.A. Koli, Head Dept. of Economics, Shivaji University, Kolhapur & Prof. D.S. Janbandhu, Nagpur University, Nagpur.

The college hosted the North Maharashtra University English Teachers Association’ 11<sup>th</sup> annual conference on 11<sup>th</sup> Feb. 2006. The theme of the conference was “Modernity & Its implications”. Hon’ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. R.S. Mali inaugurated the conference. 49 teachers from various colleges in the university jurisdiction attended. 6 papers was presented.

Computer Science Department of the college regularly conducts “Computer Literacy Programme” for the benefit of students & teachers. This year the dept. conducted “Internet access & training” course for 4 batches of students that covered 55 students.

## 28. Financial aid to students :

Besides exemption of fees to students under various schemes of government a novel scheme titled, “earn & learn” continues to run in the college. Economically challenged students are identified and assigned some job in the library, college office and laboratories. The timing is so adjusted that normal college schedule of the students is not disturbed. This year 38 students got benefited under the scheme. An amount of Rs.48,252/- was spent for the purpose.

### **Explain the plans of the institution for the next year :**

The meeting of the internal Quality Assurance Cell was held on April 24, 2006. The members reviewed the suggestions made by the cell in its previous meeting held on April 15, 2005. Suggestions made by Quality Advisory Committee in its meeting held on April 2, 2006 were also discussed. After deliberations following suggestions were made by the cell members for implementation in the ensuing academic year viz. 2006-07.

1. The members were unanimous in concluding that due to rapid growth of the college lack of space is proving an impediment in the further development of the college. This aspect needs immediate attention and future planning on this aspect is long overdue.
2. Members recommended that girls common room should be improved and properly equipped.
3. New toilets for male & Female staff members should be constructed at convenient points.
4. The college should introduce Post Graduate Courses. The members recommended Commerce & Economics subjects to start with.
5. Placement cell needs to be installed & teachers assigned this job on rotation basis. This work should be shouldered by the teachers over & above their normal work.
6. Psychology department should introduce various programmes that aim at improving the work culture of the non-teaching staff & Also their personality development
7. Computer department should get more involved in conducting short courses aimed at imparting basic knowledge about the working of the computer to the staff & the students.

8. departmental libraries especially in Arts & Commerce faculties should be strengthened so that students get a better access to the books as desired by them through the feed back.
9. conduct of more seminars / Conferences / workshops in the college is desired.
