**Part A :**

**What is the plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement & what is the outcome by the end of the year ?**

Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the college met on 25<sup>th</sup> April, 2009. Resolutions in the form of following suggestions were passed. The members also took notice of the inferences from the feedback obtained from the students with the help of a questionnaire and also the feedback received through two suggestion boxes and feedback from the guardians / parents

- 1) It was suggested that a building on 3000 sq.feet area, adjacent to the college building that is on sale, be acquired. The FSI so gained be used for construction of a building for primary school. This will relieve pressure on the main campus to some extent.
- 2) Management must prepare a master plan of at least coming 10 years.
- 3) Teachers must be encouraged to take up research activities in the form of Minor and Major Research projects.
- 4) Possibility of extension of library be probed. Improvement in the reference section be made
- 5) Re-accreditation process be actively pursued. Report writing and other related activities be taken at a faster pace.
- 6) Working in the library and office need to be fully computerized. Any short comings reported in the software be immediately got rectified by the concerned personnel.
- 7) A committee be framed that would make suggestions and help in their implementation regarding campus beautification.

**Action initiated on the suggestions made by IQAC is as follows :**

1. The Management had to give up the plan of purchasing the 3000 sq. feet area adjacent to the College building, which was on sale, due to some technical & practical difficulties. However, it has been decided that a new three one more floor should be built on the building no.II immediately in the campus to ease or the pressure out the main campus. Similarly, the Management is probing the feasibility of demolishing the old, main building to construct a new 07- storey building with all the amenities.
2. The Management is preparing a master plan of at least coming 10 years. The work will be completed very soon.
3. The teaching faculty has been encouraged to apply for M.R.P. and registration for M. Phil. / Ph.D. The expected results are reported in the answer to Question No. 8
4. Library and Reading Room extension has been given a prime importance in the action program of the Management. It is decided to build a two-storey hall adjacent to the Library in its North.
5. The Steering Committee has actively pursued the process of Re-accreditation. The Criterion –wise reports for five years (2003-04 to 2007-08) are ready along with the Departmental profiles and evaluative reports upto 2009-10. the supplementary criterion-wise. Reports for the years 2008-09, and 09-10 are being prepared. The Letter of Intent has been dispatched to NAAC, Bangalore on 28<sup>th</sup> August 2008.
6. The work of computerization of the Library is being done at a faster pace. The office has used the MKCL software for the on-line eligibility of students and filling of the admission and examination forms.
7. A sub-committee carved out of the Steering Committee, made an extensive survey of the campus and suggested that a concrete path as an inner approach road to the Main building – Canteen – Urinal units – Institution's office – Building 2 and 3 should be built. Ever green – plant pots should be

kept at convenient places. More efforts should be made to keep Campus clean. The Report of these suggestions was placed in the Steering Committee Meeting. It was accepted and forwarded to the Management for further proper action.

## **Part B :**

### **1. Activities reflecting the goals & objectives of the Institution :**

Besides regular activities of the N.S.S. and N.C.C. units, the Arts Circle, Science Association, Gymkhana Committee, Staff Academy, Career Guidance & Counseling Committee, Competitive Exam Centre, Planning Forum, Alumni Association, Teacher-Parents Association, Scholarship Committee etc. all together help the Institution in fulfilling our goals & objectives.

A] The N.S.S. regular activities included -

- i) 'Nirmalya' collection for water conservation & save environment from pollution;
- ii) Blood donation;
- iii) Blood group checking;
- iv) Organization of lectures on various topics of Social & National interests.
- v) AIDS Awareness;
- vi) Drive for clean campus

However, apart from these regular activities, following significant activities were taken up by the NSS unit of our College –

- i) NSS volunteers visited the Kathewadi settlement and informed them of the epidemic of Swine Flue and the care to be taken.
- ii) The campaign 'A Day for my Jalgaon' to search for the 'Children outside the School' was taken up by the Volunteers in the slum area of Jalgaon to register the names of such students, the report of which submitted to the Collector of Jalgaon.
- iii) On the N.S.S. Foundation Day a rally was organized to create an awareness about blood-donation, tree plantation, woman-empowerment, water-conservation, literacy spread, hazards of smoking, female foeticide etc.
- iv) This year the NSS unit celebrated 'Gandhi-week', to commemorate the Gandhian thoughts and Gandhiji's contribution in the nation-building through individual character building. Various programmes like expert- lectures

followed by 'Pledge for non violence', Poster & rangoli competition on Gandhian philosophy, story telling competition, objective type test on the Gandhian thoughts etc were arranged.

- v) N.S.S. volunteers made the inauguration ceremony of the South-West Zone Women Football Tournaments, colourful by presenting 'Marathmole Gane Amuche' group dance
- vi) The N.M.U. organized 'Utkarsha -2010' a state level cultural competition for the N.S.S. units from all over the Maharashtra State. Our college unit presented a patriotic group song along with a folk-song, and instrumental orchestra.

All these activities of the N.S.S. unit aimed at overall development of the girls alongwith their academic upliftment.

B] The N.C.C. Cadets as usual paved the path for 'a strong nation with sound body & mind' by participating various regular and a few noteworthy activities as mentioned below-

- 1) Participation in Camps : Our cadets participated in the 'Avhan' Camp, Aurangabad and Jalgaon, RD selection Camp Amaravati; ATC Camp, Faizpur; TSC & CATC camps, Akot and made a mark there as well.  
For 'B' cert examination 16 cadets attempted 02 of them got through with 'A' grade, 04 bagged B grade and remaining passed with 'C' grade, only one cadet could appear for the 'C' cert exam and get through with 'C' grade.
- 2) Salute to Freedom Fighters' Wives : The N.C.C. unit organized a memorable program of Saluting the Wives of the Freedom Fighters on 15<sup>th</sup> August 2010, the Independence Day.

C] Apart from these, various extra and co-curricular activities were organized by the Arts Circle & the Science Association alongwith the Debating Club, Career Guidance, Counseling Committee etc , which greatly helped the Institution to fulfil our goals.

D] During the year under-report, the feedback Questionnaire were got filled up by the stake holders viz parents and students. A very useful and

brainstorming analysis of various services was done by the parents and students. The Feedback Committee submitted its report to the Management which helped the Management to chalk out line of action on the infrastructure development and other services provided on the Campus.

- E] The second and Third year students from all the faculties threw 'Welcome-parties' to the F.Y.B.A.; F.Y.B.Com and F.Y.B.Sc students in the month of September so as to creatively introduce them to the college life. The events were completely managed by the students. Annual social gathering 2010 was another big bonanza for the students. It gave a 'free-for-all' opportunity to exhibit their hidden talents. The Arts Circle managed the event with the active participation of students.
- F] The Parent-Teacher Association organized meeting of the parents to get feedback on the quality of education and other services provided by the college.

**35. Activities of the Career Guidance and Counseling Committee:**

During the year 2009-10 the committee organized various activities for the promotion of competitive skills along with personality development of the students.

- 1) A Lecture of Mrs. Mamta Rathi, Director, 'The Creation', was organized on Career Opportunities for students in the corporate sector.
- 2) Dy. Manager of the Reymond Company, Jalgaon, Mr. R.S. Tomar spoke on Body Language in the Personal Interview.
- 3) Mr. D. S. Chougule, Assist. General Manager, Bank of Maharashtra, guided the students on making project proposals.
- 4) A three day Cooking Training Workshop was organized in collaboration with the 'Kabra Institute of Cooking', in which the students were taught various recipes.
- 5) An exhibition of the Hand Made Articles was organized to promote the creative abilities of the students. Near about 43 stalls for the display of different articles were there in the exhibition.
- 6) The committee in collaboration with the Commerce Dept. organized a Mock Interview Programme for the students.

The Placement Cell tries to arrange for placement camps for the students every year in collaboration with local companies / industries.

**37. Development programme for Non-teaching staff:**

A one month workshop for the non-teaching staff for the development of using computer skills was organized in collaboration with Computer Dept. of the college.

**38. Any other relevant information the institution wishes to add :**

The college was established in 1984 with a motto to provide education at different levels for the girls from rural area. Near about 2100 girl students have enrolled during the academic year 2009-10 for various courses from the Science, Arts and Commerce faculties.

We have our own building in the heart of the city to ensure the safety of the students. A hostel on the campus with all the facilities is also available. College has a rich Central Library having more than 30000 books, research journals and periodicals. The Library is being computerized to facilitate the speedy location of books. College provides some specific programs to provide financial aid to the students. Learn & Earn Scheme is one of it.

Model classroom equipped with modern T / L facilities is available. One assembly hall having capacity of 250 chairs with modern AV Aids is in day to day use for various programs in the college.

All departments are thriving with energetic and academic faculty members, many of whom are involved in research, projects, creative writing and other extension activities. One of our faculty member is a chief editor of International Journal of Pharmacology and Biological Sciences; while the other one is the General Secretary of the Teachers Organization on the University level. Many of the teachers have completed their minor research projects and 06 are still engaged with on-going projects.

College publishes an annual magazine 'Shardiya' to give vent to creative voices of the students. The magazine has received many awards so far by the North Maharashtra University.

College also runs professional courses to provide job opportunities for the students. We have a placement cell in the college. Our college has the Chanakya Competitive Examination Centre for MPSC, UPSC and other Competitive Examinations.

Our students have also participated and bagged positions in different games at the College, University and National levels. The NSS unit of our college is working excellently to excel the expectations of the University and the State authorities

In short the Institution is marching ahead with the sole aim of liberating women from the shackles of the age old social bondages and make them stand on their own feet.

## **Part C :**

### **Explain the plans of the institution for the next year :**

Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the college met on 29<sup>th</sup> April 2010. Resolutions in the form of following suggestions were passed. The members also took notice of the inferences from the feedback obtained from the students with the help of a questionnaire & also the feedback received through two suggestion boxes & feedback from the guardians /parents.

- i) It was suggested that the earlier plan of purchasing an adjacent building should be abandoned. So as to pursue a new plan of 3 / 4 storey building on the campus to ease out the pressure on the main campus.
- ii) A master plan for the infrastructure development is to be prepared for improved and modernized basic amenities like canteen, girls common room, spacious Gym, cosmetic changes in staff room, sanitary units etc.
- iii) It was suggested that more concentration should be on doctoral and post doctoral research along with seeking new ways of revenues by submitting proposals to different funding agencies.
- iv) It was resolved to submit a proposal for the women study centre to the UGC.
- v) It was suggested that the library should become a source of knowledge and the students must have a free access to books in the library. The computerization of the library in the real sense of the term, is to be completed in the near future.
- vi) It was resolved that the I.Q.A.C. must meet frequently in the year to come in the light of the Reaccreditation process to be geared up.
